## Update of FCWC Fisheries Regional managment and Fighting IUU PLANS





Working together to stop illegal fishing Ensemble pour la lutte contre la pêche illégale



### **CONTEXT**

The 9<sup>th</sup> Ministerial Conference of the FCWC held in Monrovia, Liberia in 2016 made several recommendations including:

Recommendation 6: Requested the development and implementation of a Regional Fisheries Management Plan in the FCWC region that could among others facilitate: exchange of personnel and expertise in fisheries; collaboration with regional bodies on MCS strategies to combat IUU fishing; as well as help in the revision of the FCWC Regional Plan of Action for combating IUU fishing.

**Recommendation 9**: Requested the support of the African Union (AU) for among others, **to evaluate the implementation of the 2009 FCWC RPOA-IUU by the member States.** 



### **CONTEXT (CONT')**

The AU-IBAR recruited consultants under the AU-IBAR Fisheries Governance Project, to, among others, revise the 2009 RPOA-IUU for FCWC as may be required by member States and current developments towards formulating a realistic Regional IUU Plan and Fisheries management for the FCWC.

This consultancies were complementary to AU-IBAR's support to enhancing regional cooperation on MCS (AU-IBAR, 2016a) and consistent with the implementation of Policy Framework and Reform Strategy for fisheries and aquaculture in Africa (PFRS), AUC-NPCA, 2014.

The two plans were adopted at the consultative workshop, on 7-8 May, 2018, at AU-IBAR Headquarters.



# DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A FCWC REGIONAL FISHERIES MANAGEMENT 2019-2023



### **DIAGNOSTICS AND FINDINGS**

- 1 The existence of **shared stocks**;
- 2 Cross-border mobility of fleets in the sub-region, especially small-scale fleets;
- The need to harmonize management measures given the interdependence and overlap of the maritime fisheries of the countries of the subregion;
- The need to develop a regional strategy for the conservation of fisheries resources and fragile ecosystems through the creation of Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) whose expected benefits go beyond the maritime boundaries of a single State, etc.



### **KEY CONTAINS OF THE RFMP**

- ✓ It demonstrates the coherence of this Plan with regional and international instruments, including:
- (i) AU Policy Framework for Strategic Fisheries and Aquaculture Reform (PFRS);
- (ii) the Regional Fisheries Program and the WAEMU Fishing Guidelines;
- (iii) the FAO Code of Conduct for Responsible Fisheries (CCPR);
- (iv) the FAO Voluntary Guidelines to Ensure the Sustainability of Small-Scale Fisheries in the Context of Food Security and Poverty Eradication (PA Guidelines),



### THE OBJECTIVE

The Regional Fishery Management Plan is to contribute to **the improvement of food security and the economic and social well-being** of FCWC Member States.

More specifically, the Plan aims to create the conditions for the sustainable management of FCWC's marine fisheries by strengthening subregional cooperation.



### KEY CONTAINS OF THE RFMP (CONT')

- ✓ Four (4) Expected Results of the Regional Fisheries Management Plan :
- (i) Consolidation of ongoing initiatives in the region
- (ii) Harmonization of policies, laws and regulations governing marine fisheries;
- (iii) Regulation of access to resources for artisanal fisheries
- (iv) Shared stock management;

### **DIAGNOSTICS AND FINDINGS**

An evaluation of the existing 2009 FCWC RPOA-IUU was made.

This assessment brought out:

- 1. Achievement of the objectives of the RPOA-IUU
- 2. Outstanding Priority Measures
- 3. Challenges in Implementing the RPOA-IUU
- 4. Most Common IUU Fishing Practices
- 5. Recommendations for consideration in a revised RPOA-IUU
- ✓ Based on these findings a revised FCWC RPOA-IUU was draft for the period of 2019- 2023



### **KEY CONTAINS OF THE RPOA-IUU**

The revised RPOA-IUU is for the period 2019 – 2023 and presented in three (3) Parts.

- ✓ Part 1 gives an overview of international and global context of IUU fishing;
- ✓ Part 2 presents the fisheries profile in the FCWC Region and specific concerns regarding IUU fishing;
- ✓ Part 3 outlines range of measures and the timeframe for implementation of the measures at national and regional levels to combat IUU fishing in the FCWC Region.



### **RPOA-IUU IDENTIFIED 56 MEASURES:**

### THE 56 MEASURES TO BE IMPLEMENTED UNDER THE FOLLOWING BROAD AREAS

- 1 Ratification of international instruments;
- 2 Completion, adoption and harmonization of national laws;
- 3 Measures relating to ships without nationality and non-cooperating states;
- 4 Development of **the monitoring**, **control and surveillance system** at national and regional levels;
- **5 Cooperation** between the FCWC and other states and regional fisheries organizations;
- 6 registration and register of fishing vessels and artisanal canoes;
- 7 issuance of licenses **to artisanal canoes and industrial** fishing vessels;
- 8 Port state control;
- 9 International trade in products from illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing;
- 10 and **cooperation** within regional fisheries management organizations.



### THE PLAN IDENTIFIES THE FOLLOWING PRIORITY ACTIONS/MEASURES

- Development and adoption of NPOA-IUU;
- Ratification/accession/signing of international instruments, FCWC conventions, au agreements and RFMO/RFO (ICCAT/ATLAFCO) conventions;
- 3. Strengthening and improvement of **MCS system**;
- 4. Awareness creation for and participation of professional associations and NGOS;
- 5. Harmonization of **deterrent sanctions**;
- 6. Access control;
- 7. Strengthening of **research and dissemination** of research findings;
- 8. **Port** control measures;
- 9. **Export** control measures;
- 10. Appointment **of focal persons** for implementation of RPOA-IUU.
